Schools requiring Estyn review following Section 28 inspection

As you know, we recently worked with Cardiff local authority to review the progress the school has made since the core inspection. Here is a summary of the main discussion points:

- Leadership has strengthened in the school, and senior leaders provide suitable direction and accountability
- The school has aligned improvement processes to focus on the impact of actions. This gives leaders an accurate view of the school, and an understanding of what needs to improve
- There has been a restructure of leadership roles which provides greater clarity and a wider understanding of the improvement priorities
- There is a strengthened focus upon teaching and assessment in the school
- The school has improved provision to support the progressive development of pupils' skills
- The school has established a behaviour policy. This is providing greater consistency of behaviour management across the school, and enables teachers to deal with any behaviour issues more successfully in the classroom
- The school is developing a purposeful culture of learning

Outcome of the review

St Illtyds RC High School is judged to have made appropriate progress in respect of the key issues for action, and in developing the capacity to continue to bring about improvements. We will now remove the school from the list of schools requiring Estyn review. There will be no further monitoring activity in relation to this inspection.
